Dear members of the ISHD, dear colleagues,

what an extraordinary year will soon be behind us! In this newsletter, I would just like to express the heartfelt hope of the ISHD Board that all of you have made it through this very challenging year in good health and without serious professional losses in research and teaching.

At the same time, we sincerely hope that the coming year 2021 will provide better circumstances for all of us and offer the chance for many of us to meet again in face-to-face at the ICHS conference in Poznań (Poland).

1. ICHS (CISH) conference 2021 in Poznań (Poland)

As I informed you in early summer, the ICHS Board and the ICHS Poznań Organizing Committee saw themselves forced to cancel the 2020 Congress due to the pandemic. They decided to postpone it to August 22-28, 2021, whereby the programme remained valid unchanged.

In the meantime, the organizers have informed us that the conference in August 2021 will be held in a hybrid form, which means that the sections will comprise both face-to-face and online lectures.

If there should be any changes on the part of speakers in the ISHD sessions, we kindly ask to inform the chairs of the respective section immediately.

2. General Assembly 2021 in the context of the ICHS (CISH) conference in Poznań

In the context of the conference in Poznań, the Board will invite the ISHD members to a General Assembly, which, according to the Statutes, has to be held at least every three years. We assume that in Poznań the technological prerequisites will be in place for members who are not present on site to participate online in our General Assembly. We will inform you in time.

3. Upcoming ISHD conferences 2022 and 2023

The postponement of the conference in Poznan for one year also meant, among other things, that the international ISHD conferences planned for 2021 and 2022 had in turn to be deferred by one year.

For the next conference after Tutzing, the ISHD was generously invited by Markus Furrer and the History Didactics Department at the University of Teacher Education in Lucerne (Switzerland). Once again, many thanks for this great commitment! The conference in Lucerne will now take place in 2022 - specifically from *Monday*, 5 September, to Wednesday, 7 September 2022, and will deal with the fundamental question 'Why History Education?'.

The call for papers and further information will be published resp. be sent to you after the completion of the ICHS (CISH) conference in Poznań in the autumn of 2021.

For the year of 2023 the ISHD was gratefully invited by Mare Oja to the University of Tallinn (Estonia). Mare also deserves a lot of thanks for this great offer. The definite date and topic of this conference are not yet fixed. We will discuss these issues at the General Assembly in 2021.

Furthermore, I would like to inform our members that the Board is open to invitations for the ISHD conferences in 2024 or in 2026. We will gladly receive proposals from your side.

For 2025, we expect the ISHD conference to be integrated as usual into the framework of the next of the five-yearly ICHS (CISH) conference. In the context of the ICHS/CISH-conferences, I would like to remind you as ISHD members of the following: Since the ISHD focuses specifically on the field of the didactics of *history*, it has been accepted – due to the strong efforts of Karl Pellens – as a regular member of the ICHS (CISH) – the world association of Historical Sciences. In this way, every five years our Society is given the great opportunity to present its researches in this prominent and influential forum.

4. The ISHD journal: JHEC 41 (2020) and 42 (2021)

The Board is very pleased to inform you that this year's volume of the JHEC again again has been published in a timely manner – for Autumn 2020. The cover topic 'History Education and Migration' refers to the very well attended ISHD conference in Tutzing (Germany) in 2019.

Very warm and emphatic thanks go again this year to all those who have contributed to this remarkable publication with their commitment: the skilled and inspired authors, the very responsible peer reviewers, the generous language editor Terry Haydn, and especially the managing editor Joanna Wojdon, who again very efficiently managed the entire process from receiving the proposals to organizing the peer reviews to the setting the galley proofs and the consultations with the other Board members.
