The renewed postponement of the CISH conference (from 2021 to 2022) entails further changes that I would like to inform you about.

1. ICHS (CISH) conference 2022 in Poznań (Poland)

The ICHS Board and the ICHS Poznań Organizing Committee decided to postpone the 2020 Congress due to the pan-demic a second time. Now it will take place in **August 21-27, 2022**. The programme remains unchanged.
